Impact seen on pupils' PE and sport participation and attainment

Children participate in a greater range of sports, both in curricular and extra curricular settings - competitions and after-school clubs. Professional coaches, working alongside teachers, lead to an increased percentage of children attaining expected and surpassing outcomes.

How the improvements are sustainable in the future

With the use of specialist coaches and our sports partnership, staff can continue to use the skills and knowledge they have gained. Partnerships with other local schools will continue to form through our participation in competitions leading to further opportunities for increased sporting engagement of pupils.

Year 6 2018 to 2019:

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50% can swim competently, confidently and proficiently over a distance of at least 25 metres.

47% can use a range of strokes effectively.

37% can perform safe self-rescue in different water-based situations.
