### Learning Project - to be done throughout the week

**The project this week aims to provide opportunities for your child to learn more about the Vikings.**

- **Viking Crossword**: Can your child create their own Viking themed crossword? They will need to include a list of clues and an answer sheet.
- **Viking Longship**: Follow the instructions on the link [http://downloads.bbc.co.uk/history/handsonhistory/vikings\\_figurehead.pdf](http://downloads.bbc.co.uk/history/handsonhistory/vikings_figurehead.pdf) and design a longship figurehead.
- **Viking longhouses**: Ask your child to use paper or cardboard and a range of materials around the home to design and create their own Viking longhouse. Watch the clip for some ideas:
