Ou - Shout it out! Today you will be reading a Phonics book from Oxford Owl. See below for how to log in and which book you should read.</p>	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Let's sing along and learn numbers 1-20 with words! Watch it again, but this time pause the video to try your best to learn the spelling of the words. Practice writing numbers 1 to 20 in words. Eg. 1 = one Enjoy playing this game. Read the instructions on the web page and pick the level that says '1-20'. Match the numbers with the words. How long did it take you to complete this task? Look at the top left hand corner to read the time. Now play it again and see if you can beat your own score this time! 	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> Listen to Ms Islam introduce our new English book called The Secret Sky Garden. Answer the following question: What is the title of our new story? What does author mean? Who wrote this story? What is a blurb? Write your prediction on how you think Funni and Zoo will meet in the story. How will Zoo find Funni and the secret garden? You can also draw a picture to show me. 	<p>Our PSHE unit this term will focus on 'Growth', which is also linked to our learning in science 'What do plants need to grow?'. Children will be learning to recognise and reflect on their achievements and set goals to achieve them in the future.</p> <p>Question What is an achievement? Watch this video to learn about different types of 'achievements'. Then complete the activity to identify what the children have achieved.</p> <p>Think about your own achievements and share these memories with your family. Some examples could be:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Getting dressed for school all by yourself - Trying new food

4. Find your book, which is called 'What is this?'

What to do:

- Read the speed sounds.
- Read the green and red words.
- Ask an adult to explain the key vocabulary on page 8.
- Take turns with an adult to read the story.
- Answer the questions on page 17.
- Practice the speed sounds.

- Achievement at clubs eg. swimming, football, gymnastics.

Listen to your child read. Encourage them to engage with the teacher whilst watching the videos.	You may read the words for your child, however please encourage them to use their sounds to read the words independently first.	Give your child sentence starters to help then answer the questions: The title of our new story is... Author means... ...wrote this story. A blurb is...	Encourage your child to think about how there were things that they could not do in Reception but can do now. Who/What helped them?
