<u>A Guide For Parents:</u> <u>listening to your child read</u> <u>aloud</u> YOUNGER CHILDREN (5-7years)



- Talk about the front cover together.
- Does it remind them of another story or book?
- Do they recognise any of the characters?
- What do they think might happen in the story or book?
- Do they have any questions they would like to find out about, in the book?

If your child gets stuck on a word use the three Ps: PAUSE - PROMPT - PRAISE

First...

PAUSE

Give your child a chance to try and say the tricky work - wait for a few seconds before...

then...

PROMPT

Here are some useful question prompts:

- Which part of the word are you having trouble with?
- Look at the beginning of the word carefully.
- Look at the end of the word carefully.
- Does it sound right? Do we say it like that?
- •Which sounds can you see in the word?
- •Reread the sentence does that help? What word would make sense?
- •Read on to the end of the sentence does that help? What word would make sense?
- •Look at the picture. Is there a clue in the picture?
- Is it a tricky word that you know?
- Is it a word we have read before in this book?
- Is the word like any other word you know?
- Don't let them struggle too long or just guess! Tell the child the word if a few prompts are not working.

then...

PRAISE

Praise the child for any attempt to work something out for themselves. Say 'Well done. I really like the way that you...........'
